Clear pleasant weather with moderate westerly breezes all hands variously employed on deck two sails in sight standing to the southward and Westward

This day commenced with moderate breeze and cloudy weather middle part the same latter part clear pleasant weather two sails in sight standing to the South all hands well and happy

Clear pleasant weather with moderate breezes spoke and boarded a Baltimore ship bound to Baltimore put letters on board of her the watch variously employed in ships duty

Clear pleasant weather with light breezes throughout this day the watch variously employed in ships duty

Pleasant weather with moderate breezes throughout this day at 5h AM made the Island of Flores one of the Azores distant 45 miles at mid day the Captain and boats crew went on shore

Sunday 30 June

Clear pleasant weather with light air the ship lying off and on the harbour of Santa Cruz one boat steered round away the Captain on shore trading off for potatoes Fowls and Onions

Monday 1 July

Clear pleasant weather with light breeze throughout lying off and on Flores take on board 150 bushel potatoes 1000 onions 6 pigs 24 fowl and one monkey

Tuesday 2 July

Clear weather with light breezes throughout at 11h PM squared away for Fayall spoke the ship Hibernia of New Bedford clear
