Clear weather for the most part with strong breezes nothing in sight throughout this day one man very sick with Rheumatism caught a porpoise to day which was very acceptable found that there was two packs of Cards in the fore-castle got one of them and bore it over board as the man was gambling gamblers of the man a workup job for gambling no prospects of doing anything this voyage and as the second mate says it looks Dubergues

Cloudy weather through this day first part saw several fin backs and grampuses at 7h 20m A.M. raised a whale lowered the three harbour boats and the Waist boat struck at 9h got him alongside and commenced cutting in lost the head and one of the lips ~~finished~~ cut the blubber so fat that all tore away nothing more in sight carried double reefed top sail all night standing South

Monday 18 Nov 1844

Cloudy weather with strong breeze in the first part middle and latter blowing strong gales at 4h P.M. raised a whale lowered the two quarter boats and waist boat and the waist boat struck but parted from the whale and lost him at sundown returned on board

Tuesday 19 Nov

Blowing strong gales with a heavy sea running saw two whales to day finished boiling at 12h P.M. latter part clear moderate weather saw one whale at 5h N.E. but lost sight of him again this is considered good whale ground at this season of the year but in the latter part of Decr in the lat 40 S

Wednesday 20 Nov

Clear pleasant weather in the middle and latter parts of the day nothing in sight whatever got to leeward of our ground again the same as has been since we sailed cant keep on any ground three days at a time all through bad management in my opinion for as sure as we see whales so sure we keep to the Eastward the Captain still keeps saying that there must be some Jona on board but it is very well known where the Jona is on board of this ship in the hold in the run in a barrel and two kegs
