First and middle parts calm with heavy thick weather at 7h P.M. a thunder storm came on and lasted throughout the night at 4h it commenced blowing from the North East very heavy hauled to North and N W at 4h 30m tacked ship to the Eastward a sail in sight

Light breezes throughout this day several hours of rain steering to the N W winds from the N E to N
