Saturday 24 May 1845

Blowing heavy throughout this day with several falls of snow no whales in sight whatever steering a course to the North Westward

Monday 26 May

Moderate pleasant until 6h P.M. at 1h 20 in P.M. lowered after one whale without success came on board found the Barometer on a stand at 29.8th and all secure for a heavy gale at 8h P.M. the gale first with a heavy crop sea at 12h P.M. stove the bow boat by shipping a sea and the ship taking a sea lurch at the same time blowing tremendous heavy throughout the rest of this day with falls of snow

Tuesday 27 May

First part blowing very heavy middle part more moderate latter part mostly calm at 12h P.M. tacked to the North nothing in sight took the bow boat to repair her and put out another old boat in her place

Blowing heavy throughout this day latter part raised whales lowered without success a ship in sight standing to the North several whales in sight to day Captain and Carpenter repairing the bow boat

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Thursday 29 May 1845

Blowing strong gales throughout this day at 3h P.M. raised whales lowered without success several whales in sight latter part saw two ships standing to the southward and Westward finished the boat and under close reefed main top sail fore sail main Spencer and standing to the North

Friday 30 May

Blowing strong breezes throughout this day saw five ships to day all standing to the Westward at 10h A.M. saw a ship on the horizon get a whale ran down and spoke her the Crescent of Sag Harbour got three whales this season saw a number of hump backs and fin backs

Saturday 31 May

Light breezes throughout this day ~~and~~ overcast at 4h 40m A.M. saw a whale lowered all the boats after him ~~the~~ the Bow boat struck but after getting him killed he sunk ~~on~~ on board and steared by the wind to the North ~~and~~ and of fin backs in sight
