Monday 2 June 1845

Blowing heavy throughout the first and middle parts of this day at 1h 30m lowered after one whale without success at 4h 30m lowered after two whales the mate fastened but parted his line so returned on board when the bow boat came along side she got up set and came very near drowning all the boats crew however all the crew got on board sadly wore out from such immersion in the water got the boat on board with the gunwail broke and several planks stove in latter part all hands getting out the bow boat and fixing the boats saw several whales did not lower being thick and foggy

Blowing strong gales throughout this day lying too two sails in sight to the Westward no whales in sight

Saturday 7 June 1845

Blowing heavy gales from the North to North West throughout this day no whales in sight lying too all the day at 6h 30m tacked to the W at 7h 30m tacked to the North East

Sunday 8 June

Calm throughout the most part of this day first part saw three whales but too late to lower for them at 6h 30m saw two whales lowered and the Starboard boat missed pulled for some time without success the Gold Hunter in sight to the West

Monday 9 June

Calm throughout this day and foggy at 1h 20m P.M. raised two whales lowered without success the Gold Hunter in sight this is the first fine weather that we have had since we have been on the North West

Tuesday 10 June

Calm throughout the most part of this day at 6h 30m raised two whales lowered without success in company with the ship Gold Hunter at 7h 30m raised more whales lowered all four boats and the Gold Hunter three boats the other ship boats struck first then we struck but he sunk chased two more whales without success returned on board in a thick fog and stood to the Northward
