Saturday 21 June 1845

Light air and calm throughout this day and over cast plenty of whales in sight also several ships all trying hard for whales at 10h Pm finished cutting in the whale

Light air in the first part middle and latter part calm plenty of whales in sight all hounded to the W and N W three sails in sight

Tuesday 24 June

Calm throughout this day at 5h 30m commenced raining and continued the same throughout at 10h Pm finished boiling at day light commenced stowing down three sails in sight also saw several whales

Wednesday 25 June

A continual rain throughout this day at 5h Pm finished stowing down commenced blowing a gale to the N in sail and made all secure and laid the ship heading to the North West one barge in sight

Friday 27 June 1845

Blowing strong through the most part of this day spoke the Condor of N B 6 whales this season latter part saw two Carcasses but no whales three sails in sight

Saturday 28 June

Light winds and foggy from the North West saw one whale today but going so fast that we could do nothing to him first part three sails in sight two boiling all steaming by the wind to the Northward saw several carcasses and grampuses the water today is very thick and muddy every appearance that there is soundings in 60 or 80 fathoms three men sick

Sunday 29 June

Thick foggy weather throughout this day nothing in sight but one fin back carried double reefed topsails through the night to the North East

Tuesday 1 July

Blowing fresh gale at 11h 30m Pm saw one whale at 3h 30m saw three whales lowered the three harbour boats without success at 5h saw three more at 6h 5m saw several more at 12h Pm fogged a ship boiling out to the N saw several more whales all going North West so fast that there was no use to lower for them three sails in sight
