Moderate breezes throughout foggy and
overcast throughout at 4h 30m P.M. saw two whales
going to the South East as if the devil was after
them at 9h 10m spoke the ship Calumet of
Houmington 20 months out 2000 two whales this season
had a man fell from her fore top sail yard and and
killed dead that makes the seventh that has been
killed on board of her this voyage we are running all
over the Ocean North South East and West
and nothing to be seen it appears that there
was not a whale in the Ocean for us

Tuesday 15 July

Blowing strong breezes throughout this day
from East to North at 3h P.M. spoke the Barque
Newburyport of Stonington 10 whales at 8h P.M.
spoke the Ship Brunswick of New Bedford 7 Whales
when we were gamming with her the ship Rowena
spoke the Brunswick and stood along for a few
miles and picked up a whale in first rate order
I may say that we expect that one by gamming as it
was on our course the Brunswick was boiling and blowing
down

Wednesday 16 July

First and middle parts foggy latter clear
with pleasant weather at 10h 40m A.M. raised the
Kamatcha shore covered with snow at 8h P.M.
saw 5 whales bound south standing in towards the
land in hopes to fall in with whales latter part
saw nothing whatever find the current running so
strong to the South that the ship heading North West
scarcely holds her own to the North
