Light winds throughout this day from the Westward at 10h 30m D.M. made the Western continent of America in Lat 31 19 North Long 117 15 West of Greenwich found the Chronometer 2 degrees out of the way caught a porpoise saw several fin backs

Thursday 20 Nov

Light breezes throughout this day steering South East down along the land for bare Island saw some hump backs the land about 25 miles off the land hereabouts is very uneven and high seem to be many fine bays along the coast

Light winds throughout this day the land in sight at 8.2 D.M. spoke the ship Mesa of New York jammed with her all day she ran with us all day for the Island we were bound to saw a whale spout 40 times called him a sperm whale the Capt. went to the mast head and lost the run of him
