

# Journal

Monday 2 Jan'y 1846

At 4 1/2 P.M. weighed anchor in the port of Lahina bound to Waahoo with light N.E. trade winds four passengers on board two men deserted from the ship while in port I pass over the days lying in port as it is not necessary to note them down

Tuesday 3 Jan'y

Strong gales from the N.E. at 2 P.M. came to anchor in the outer roads at waahoo of Wigtetta bay the Capt'n and Passengers went on shore at sunset the boat returned

Wednesday 4

Strong gales from the N.E. lying to anchor

Thursday 5 Jan'y

the same as yesterday

Friday the same

Three men ran away from the ship caught one of them again took him on board

Saturday 7 Feb

Strong trades to day at 6 P.M. weighed anchor and laid off and on the harbour for the Capt'n

Sunday 8 Feb

Moderate breezes from the N.E. at 6 P.M. all hands on board made sail and steered S.W. for sea offing then steered a course W. by N. in hunt the cables and slowed the anchors Lat 21° 45' Long 159° 00'

Monday 9 Feb

Strong trades throughout steering S.W. at 3 P.M. a boat of Otago distant 15 miles saw a ship beating to the Islands nothing in sight the Capt'n dubly as is all way the case after being in port Lat 21° 18' Long 160° 45'

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Tuesday 10 Feb 1846

Begins with strong N.E. trade winds steering W. by S. Middle and latter parts more moderate the watch employed in mending sails Lat 21° 26' Long 164° 31'

Wednesday 11 Feb

Light N.E. trade winds several showers of rain steering W. by S. employed painting the Harbour boat and in the flying jib boom Lat 21° 58' Long

Thursday 12 Feb

Light breezes and variable in the fore and middle parts latter strong breezes from N.E. steering W. by S. painting the Harbour boat and repairing the bow boat the Capt'n very sickly nothing in sight whatever Lat 21° 54' Long 164° 34'

Friday 13 Feb

Light breeze throughout the day from the East steering to the West several fin backs in sight painting boats and repairing the bow boat the Capt'n sickly Lat 21° 59' Long 166° 13'

Saturday 14 Feb

Light air from the East steering West nothing in sight caught three Albucore painted the Waist boat Lat 22° 8' Long 168° 7'

Sunday 15 Feb

Pleasant weather with light air from the East some fin backs in sight steering West one goat had two kids to day Lat 22° 12' Long 169° 4'

Monday 16 Feb

Light air from the East steering West the watch employed packing over potatoes the Capt'n making a top mast mending sails the boat getting up the blacksmiths forge nothing in sight whatever
