Saturday 6 June 1846

Pleasant breezes from the West through this day saw plenty of whales to day all very wild and growing so fast that there was no use lowering after a great many in company with the Charriot two sails in sight beautiful weather to whale it but we are running to every ship we see trying to buy provisions as we are almost out of every thing.

Sunday 7 June

Beautiful clear weather with light breezes from the West at 1h 0m lowered after one whale without success spoke the ship America, Ontario and Chandler price America was cutting a whale latter part saw the Charriot of Warren cutting in a whale just 12 hours since we saw her with nothing she intended her on business and got a whale but we had to hunt up provisions in dead of getting a voyage minus daily in sight.

Monday 8 June Strong breezes from the Westward with heavy snow storms spoke the ship Philip Tab of Warren nothing this season no whales in sight to day.

Tuesday 9 June

Strong breezes throughout this day from the West with snow. no whales in sight to day standing to the S.W. one sail in sight.

Wednesday 10 June

Strong breezes from the S.W. to day lowered after one whale without success latter part thick fog turned to thin day and made a thorough search for provisions found 11 barrels of meat four casks of bread and 15 barrels of flour all the provisions in the ship.

Thursday 11 June 1846

Light breezes from the West throughout and hazy saw several hump backs the whales are all gone or we have run away from the whales.

Friday 12 June

Light breezes from the N.W. and hazy and foggy nothing in sight what ever.

Saturday 13 June

Light breezes from the West and pleasant weather steering to S.E. nothing in sight what ever.

Lat 47 22 Long 160 45

Sunday 14 June

Light breezes from the west first part clear weather at 5h 0m lowered after a solitary whale the mate went on him but he perceived the boat and got away latter part thick fog steering to S.E.

Lat 47 07 Long 161 41

Monday 15 June

Light air from the S.W. with thick fog steering a course to S.E. where we are bound the land only knows.

Tuesday 16 June

Light breezes from the North throughout this with a thick fog steering a course East saw one or two hump backs.

Lat 47 21 Long 166 08

Wednesday 17 June

Light air from the North through the day with fog at intervals at 2h 0m saw a whale lowered after twice the mate fastened and killed him got him along side at 5h 0m commenced cutting gave up cutting at 8h 0m at 4h 0m commenced cutting finished at 6h 20m and began looking for plenty of whales.
