Wednesday 8 July 1846

Blowing fresh gale from the West in the first part middle part the wind very light latter part the wind hauled to N E a moderate breeze nothing to be seen whatever

Thursday 9 July

Light breezes from S E & throughout with rain and fog steering by the wind N E & N E nothing in sight whatever a number of the men laid up with boils

Friday 10 July

Light airs from the S E & with fog and rain steering by the wind N E nothing in sight whatever

Saturday 11 July

Blowing strong gales with fog and rain from the S W throughout the day steering E by N nothing in sight whatever

Sunday 12 July

Strong gales from the S W with fog and rain nothing in sight whatever steering E by N

Latt Long

Monday 13 July

Fresh breezes from S W thick fog for the most part steering E by N & N at noon raised one whale lowered but could not get near him

Tuesday 14 July

Fresh breezes from S W fog throughout the day steering E & N nothing in sight several men laid up

Wednesday 15 July

Moderate breezes throughout the day from the S W steering N E nothing in sight whatever

Thursday 16 July 1846

Blowing fresh gale from S W with thick overcast weather saw several hump backs this place seems to be deserted of both whales and ships

Friday 17 July

Fresh gales from S W and rugged weather foggy with rain saw fin backs steering to the N E under all sail

Latt Long

Saturday 18 July

Strong breezes from the S W and squally steering N E & N at sundown took in sail calculating to see a sail before long plenty of fin backs in sight

Sunday 19 July

Moderate breezes from S W to W first part steering N E middle and latter parts by the wind to the north at 8 h P M raised a sail at 7 h P M spoke the ship Roman of N Y 6 Whales this season she could not spare us any provision whatever no whales about here whatever most of the ships here have done with

Monday 20 July

Strong gale throughout from S W to West steering by the wind to the N E & W a very strong current setting S E the Ocean here is alive with hump backs and birds no whales to be seen the Roman in sight steering for the land

Tuesday 21 July

Light breezes and clear weather from S W in the first part middle and latter parts thick fog the wind from the South at five hours P M saw the land bearing N by S steering by the wind N E & N the Roman in sight plenty hump backs and birds
