

Sunday the 19 of April 1852
This morning we lost the fore
topsail and left off and at 5 P.M.
Call all hands and took it in a gale
and hove our ship too and so ends this day

Monday the 20 of April
This Day we had thick and sum Rain
and no wind thro this Day and so ends

Tuesday the 21 of April 1852
This Day we have it cold and a strong
gale and snow squalls the wind from
the W our ship on the wind a steering
N by W and at 5 P.M. took in
sail and set quarter watches the
Lat 44:50 Long

Wednesday the 22 of April
This Day we later under close reef
Main topsail this morning we
have snow squalls and a gale of wind
Made no sail until 2 P.M. set
the fore sail the wind from the W
the ship a heaving N so ends
Lat 35:41 Long 165:31

Thursday the 23 of April
This Day commences with a strong
breeze from the W a steering
N by W the weather cold
and long squalls so ends this
Lat 46:22 N Long 166:01

Friday the 24 of April
This Day we have good weather the wind
hall to the S a steering N N W
and at 5 P.M. set a wright up
Lat 48:14 N Long

Saturday the 25 of April
This Day we have Bad weather cold
and snow and rain the fore part
took in sail and the latter part made
it a gale and so ends the 24 ours
Lat Long

Sunday the 26 of April 1852
This Day we have a gale of wind
from the S W a steering N N W
under close reef topsails and at 9 saw
2 Whales and the wair large ones
Lat 53:20 N Long 163:02

Monday the 27 of April 1852
This Day commences with a thick snow storm
Saw a ship but we did not speak her
and at 11 we made sail and took it
in a gale this Day ends with snow and cold

Tuesday the 28 of April
This Day we have fine weather and
Calm 2 Ships in sight and the
Cape of Kamkatsky in sight the
Ship a heaving N and so ends
Lat 54:12 N Long 163:32

Wednesday the 29 of April
This Day we have fine weather and no
wind with 3 Ships and so ends the 29

Thursday the 30 of April 1852
This Day we have fine weather and
a fine breeze from the S W a steering
N N W at 10 we spoke the Ship
Genrel Pike of New Bedford a Season
with 3 Whales and so ends this Day
