

Continued 1852 on board Ship Wm Tell
Friday the 30 of April
This Day we have it thick and Snowy the wind
from the S. a Steering N. with 4
Ships in Sight and the Saw Boats
Lat 54:1 N Long

Saturday the 1 of May 1852
This is the first of May
This Day we made sail and at 01 took it
in a gale and set quarter watches a thick
Snow Storm and a Strong Breeze from the
N. 2 Ships in Sight and the land
was a plenty of ice soent this

Sunday the 2 of May 1852
This morning we saw whales lored
and the mat struck and William
set the whale a sporting dloob and
we took him a long side mat him
past the wind a blowing a gale so that
we could not cut
Monday the 3 of May

Tuesday the 3 of May
This Day we have a heavy gale of wind
and a hard Snow Storm and we
lost our whale from a long side
at 4 o'clock this morning and soent

Wednesday the 4 of May
This Day we have it cold and
Snow and Blustering the wind light
from the N. Ship on the wind
Lat 56:21 N Lon 163:50 E

Thursday the 5 of May
This Day we have fine weather and
alm we brook out all the riggen and
put it in the main and brook out the main
hatch and cleaned it out and got ready
for whaling Lat Long

Friday the 6 of May 1852
The four part of this Day a fine Breeze
latter part Calm with 14 Ships in
Sight we took the Ship Seperson of
Lag harbor and so ent this Day

Saturday the 7 of May
This Day we have Snow and cold
with 24 Ships in Sight a dotting
and this Day we have Snow
Squales and soent this Day
Lat Long

Sunday the 8 of May 1852
This Day we have a strong Breeze
from the N. and a Steering
in to the N. and E. Saw the Ship
Seperson and gamel with his a number of
Ships in Sight and more Snow and the
littel dut from up soent this Day
Lat Long

Monday the 9 of May 1852
This morning we made all sail and
at 6 took it in a gale and bedele
Reeft our topsails a gale the wind
from the N. and W. Ship on the wind
a Steering in to the E. a number of
Ships in Sight and plenty of Snow
Lat 58:13 N Long 168:30 East

Tuesday the 10 of May
This Day we have fine weather a Steering
N. E. by N. and at 2 Am Saw
the land a dout 70 miles distant
Saw 2 Ships in Sight 1 was the
Mont a variety of new delapont soent

Wednesday the 11 of May
This Day we have fine weather but cold
the wind from the N. W. a Steering
N. E. with 6 Ships in Sight and soent
