we loosed our Boats and went in to
the ice and we saw no whales and
the latter part a gaming with the
Martha of New Bedford Tucker master
and Soents this month and Day 1852

Tuesday the 1 of July
This Day commences with fog and
and Rain and ends the same

Wednesday the 2 of July 1852
This Day commences with a thick
fog and Rain and at 01 the fog
lit up and there was 20 Ships in
sight and a plenty of ice and at
2 PM we saw the Jefferson of Sag Harbor
and the Black Eagle and another gon
and Soents this Day with fog

Thursday the 3 of July 1852
This Day commences with thick fog
and Rain and Snow this Day we
left the Hogs for the forth of July
the Black Eagle and the Thomas
Jefferson in sight the weather more
moderate a back to the windward
we call the Washington of Sag Harbor
Lat 73:40 Long 177:43 we

This Day commences with a thick fog and
two Ships in sight the Thomas Jefferson
and the Washington and she got a whale in
the ice and Soents this Day

Saturday the 5 of July
This Day we have fine weather in the fore
noon and we got a whale in the ice
and cut him in and Soents

Sam
Sunday the 6 of July
This Day we have fine weather and
a plenty of whales in sight and we
got one and cut him

Monday the 7 of July
This Day we have fine weather and
a plenty of whales in sight and a
number of Ships a cutting and we
got a nother and cut him in
and Soents this Day

Tuesday the 8 of July
This Day commences with thick
fog but we air well first for it
with 3 whale in the hatch wa

Wednesday the 9 of July
This Day we have
fine thick fog and at 10 fine weather
and we have fine weather for Boiling

Thursday the 10 of July 1852
This Day we commenced Steaming Down
in the offing patch we stood down
100 Bells and Soents this Day

Friday the 11 of July
This Day commences with strong
Breezes from the S and Rugs
and we saw a Deal whale
and took him and cut him in
