This Day we have thick weather and at

at 7 the wind blew a strong Breez
from the S and we wore Ship and
healed S by N and this Day ends

Sunday the 7 of August
This Day we have a gale of wind and
a thick fog and the wind from the
S our Ship on the wind and we have
to wear Ship every 6 ours to cup
Cler of the Log and this Day ends
No 0 B

Monday the 8 of August
This Day commences with fine weather
and we Broak out apt in the Sereq
hatch on the Standard Lid and at 11
a Rain Storm and a gale of wind
and we stood 10 and 11 Barrels of
Oil and this Day ends

Tuesday the 9 of August
This Day we have a gale of wind
from the S S E our Ship on the
Wind a heaving S by E this Day
we speak the Mary Gardner with 2
Whales this Day we have a thick fog
and a Rain Storm and at 4 the weather
better and the fog lit up and we
saw a number of Ships
Sends this Day Better S S

Wednesday the 10 of August 1853
This morning we commenced going down
the rest of our Oil and at 5 finished
the wind from the S S E and we steered
S by E and we have the latter part a
thick fog a cow Whale mad 10 and 44
Barrels this Day ends
Latt Long

Thursday the 11 of August
This Day at 9 the fog lit up and
there was 6 Ships in sight and we
had a fair wind But the Captain
rather gave then to try to get whale
we lay a Back all this fore noon and
at 1 Broast fore and steered S by E
and at 8 we Broak up again with
the Ship Romulus of New London and this
Day ends the month passes away
Friday Latt 64: 46 Long

Saturday the 12 of August
This Day commences with a thick fog
and rain the latter part the wind
blew strong from the N and
we left the Strats the weather
is cold and rain and a thick fog
and this Day ends B S S
No 0 B

Sunday the 13 of August
This Day we have fog and rain
the latter part the weather more clear
the wind from the E and we air a
steering S S E the wind light and
saw Lorange Island in sight we
are a going out of the Strats Sends this
Latt 64: 30 N Long 169: 36 W

Monday the 14 of August 1853
This Day we have thick and a light
Brees from the N and W and we air a
steering N W by W and at 3 we got through the
Strats and shape our course for Berings Sea and this Day ends
