

Remarks Wednesday Aug. 15th 1855,

These 24 hours Commences with a light air from the S. & Eastward. at 1/2 past 10 Let go the Fast from Howlands Wharf. The Boat Towed her down the Bay at 1/2 past 11 she left her then made sail by the Wind S. E. Heading S. S. W. So ends these 24 hours. Home sick.

Remarks Thursday Aug. 16th 1855.

These 24 hours Commences with a moderate breeze from the S. E. Heading S. S. W. all sail out at 1/2 past 2 o'clock the Pilot left. then we Commenced securing things for sea Middle part some rain took in the light sails at 10 Midnight set the Main S. gallant. Sail Latter part Foggy Stowed down the Chains & Coiled lines & Fitting Boats So ends these 24 hours.

Remarks Friday Aug. 17th 1855.

These 24 hours Commences with a light breeze from the S. W. Heading S. S. E. by the Wind the Watch Employed in Fitting the Boats Middle part took in the light sails at 7 in the morning Doubled Reefed the Fore Top Sail Latter part strong breeze & rugged So ends these 24 hours.
