These 24 hours Commences with a light breeze from the S.S.W. latter part calm. the Watch em-^go^d in fitting main topmast

These 24 hours Commences with a calm middle part light air W.S.W. latter part baffling so ends these 24 hours.

These 24 hours Commences with a light breeze from W.S.W. Middle & latter part much the same so ends these 24 hours.

These 24 hours Commences with a moderate breeze from the S.W. heading S.S.E. at 2 P.M. saw Sperm Whales a shoal of small ones. Landed & chased until sundown did not get any so ends.

Remarks Wednesday Feb. 20th 1856.

These 24 hours Commences with light trades working to the southward overcast & smoky latter part saw plenty of squid the Watch employed in making some rope so ends these 24 hours.

Lat. 14=10 S.
