

Remarks. Tuesday Dec. 8th 1856.

These 24 hours. Commences with a light air from N. Heading to the Westward saw Hump Backs. Lowerd for them did not strike came onboard at 3 O'clock in the morning 2 Rite Whales. Came up on the star quarter & lay some minutes. We hauled back the main yard & lay untill next morning at 5 O'clock saw them on the Weather Beam. We went down to get breakfast & they lost the run of them we tacked & retacked saw nothing of them.

Remarks. Friday Jan. 29th 1857.

These 24 hours. Commences with a strong Breeze from the N.E. Steering W. at 1 P.M. Wire Ship & Steerd off S.E. at 3 P.M. Steering S.E. at 4 past 5 P.M. Saw Sperm Whales on the Weather Beam & lee beam we lowerd for them & twice at them did not get fast the Whale was under water not considered as a good Chance chased untill dark then went onboard.

Remarks. Friday Feb 5th 1857.

These 24 hours Commences with a strong Breeze at 1/2 past 6 in the morning saw Sperm Whales Porpoises in among them Lowerd for them the W. Boat struck one & lost him one Iron Broke

Lat. 32-43 N.
Long. 05-19 W.

Remarks. Saturday March 6th 1857.

These 24 hours Commences with a Light Breeze at 9 A.M. Saw Sperm Whales Lowerd & got one large Whale so Lends.

Lat. 14-50 S.
Long. 07-00 E.

Remarks. Saturday April 17th 1857.

These 24 hours Commences with a Moderate breeze Steering for St. Helena Land about 15 miles distant. Saw Sperm Whales Lowerd for them but did not get fast a Merchantman run through them & galled them.

Remarks. Thursday June 4th 1857.

These 24 hours Commences with a strong Breeze at 4 P.M. Saw Sperm Whales closed to the ship Lowerd for them they were going quick to the S.E. did not strike.
