Light breeze from the S. S. E. Steering Course  
N. by E. all sail out saw nothing

Lat. 06 = 18° N.  
Long. 17 = 57 W.

Remarks Thursday Feb. 11<sup>th</sup> 1858.

Light air & baffling light showers of rain

Lat. 02 = 44 N. Saw a Fin Back & one sail standing  
Long. 17 = 59 W. to the N. & Eastward

Remarks Friday Feb. 12<sup>th</sup> 1858.

Commences with light air & baffling saw  
a Topsail Schooner steering to the  
Southward at 5 P. M. got a Breeze  
from the N. Heading W. N. W.

Lat. 03 = 27 N.  
Long. 18 = 13 W.

Remarks Saturday Feb. 13<sup>th</sup> 1858.

Light air & Wind baffling Heading to the N.  
& Westward at Sundown Weather  
Looking black at 7 Evening heavy  
Squall & hard rain at Midnight  
More moderate Trade sail saw  
Black Fish

Lat. 03 = 51 N.  
Long. 18 = 35 W.

Remarks Sunday Feb. 14<sup>th</sup> 1858.

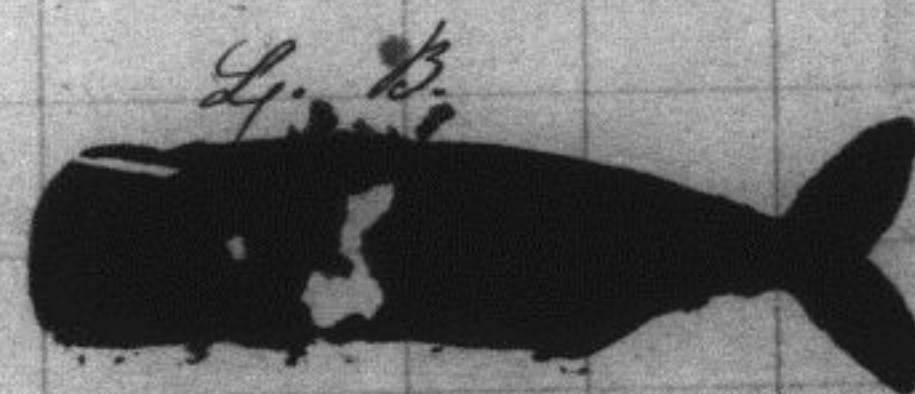
Commences with light air & saw two sails saw  
Black Fish Lowerd did not strike  
so ends.

Lat. 04 = 28 N.  
Long. 18 = 55 W.

Remarks Monday Feb. 15<sup>th</sup> 1858.

Commences with a moderate breeze standing  
to the N. W. on the Wind all sail  
out at 11 A. M. saw Sperm Whale  
at 10 Lowerd at 2 P. M. Struck  
3 of them at 5 P. M. took along  
Side L. B. 1 S. B. 1 W. B. 1

Lat. 04 = 31 N.  
Long. 19 = 02 W.



Remarks Tuesday Feb. 16<sup>th</sup> 1858.

All hands employed in cutting in  
at 4 past 10 at dawn finished  
cutting some squalls of rain  
sent down the cutting gear &  
blard away the Heads & Jams  
saw a Merchant Man saw  
Black Fish
