Lat. 29-20 N. Sail out the Watch Employed in
Long 71-00 W. Ships duty

Remarks Wednesday May 5th 1838

Fine Weather & a Moderate Breeze from
the S. E. Steering Course S.
The Watch Employed in Ships
duty took the Craft out of the

Lat. 30-20 N. Boat over head & stowed it away
Long 70-59 W. Saw a Brigg Standing to the S.

Remarks Thursday May 6th 1838

At 3 o'clock in the morning had a squall split
the Fly jib Main Top Mast Stay Sail
Carried away the fore Band to the
Fore J. Gallant Yard & Sprung the
Jib Boom Called all hands & put
her Under Short Sail at 6 A. M.
had her Under Goosed Winged
Main Top Sail Fore Top Mast Stay
Sail & Main Spencer at 1 P. M.
cleared up set the Fore Top sail
Doubled reefed & the Main.

Remarks Friday May 7th 1838

Commences with a good Breeze from the
S. W. Steering Course S. all Sail out
Saw 3 Sails and steering to the S.
Last Evening plenty of Lightning &
the Weather Bad Bent a New Main
Spencer Strong Breeze all Sail
out Saw 6 Sails at 3 P. M.

Lat. 33-47 N. Weather Looking Bad reefed down
Long 70-34 W. at Sundown Light Breeze from the
W. S. W.
