

## Remarks on Board of Ship Ngee

Sept Monday 22 1878

This day begins with a light breeze from the South later part we got our Potatoes now Ready for sea

Thurs Tuesday Sept 23 1878

This day begins with a light breeze from the North at 4 P.M. the Steamer come but not in time to distribute the mail middle part ship Laying off and on at Fayal later part the Captain and Lady come off to go to sea but the 4<sup>th</sup> Mate was not on board so we had to wait for him so End

Wednesday Sept 24 1878

This day begins with a light air from the E. & E. We made all sail at 4 P.M. and then by the wind to the Southward in company with the Bark Napoleon & Bark Wanderer middle part wind the same the Wanderer & the Napoleon Haul down in the Lee quarter we were employed breaking out and shaking old oil Casks the day we find that we have seven Stow away men on board so Ends

## Of New Bedford Mass Thomas A. Hallett

On a passage from Fayal to the South

Thurs day Sept 25 1878

This day begins with Light Breeze from the S. E. Ship by the Wind to S for the Bark Napoleon in sight middle part wind lite and unsteady later part the same persons we are employed

Friday Sept 26 1878

This day begins with light air and calm with rain squalls saw one sail today the rain from South E to S.W. middle part setting all sail later part Windy from the Southward ship by the Wind to S. E. we employed in breaking out the After Hole so Ends the day work

Lat 35.35 N Long 28.18 W

Saturday Sept 27 1878

This day begins with a light breeze from S.W. course S. E. saw one sail some porpoise middle part strong breeze from S.W. course S. by E later part send by the Wind unsteady wind from S. E. to N.W. we are employed in ships duty saw five or six sails so Ends the day Lat 34.05 N Long 25.50 W
