

Remarks On Board Of Ship Nigee Of
Ship Nigee on a paper from the
Wednesday Oct 12th 1878

This day begins with lite air from the
Northward course & by N. Nothing in sight
Middle and later part wind the same. We
are employed in ships duty so ends this day
Lat 10. 39 N. Lon 20. 53 W

Thursday Oct 13th 1878

This day begins with a lite breeze
from the Northward saw a school of
porpoise and a Sulphur bottom Whale
Middle & later part wind the same course
& by N. Nothing in sight so ends this day
work in Lat 19. 10 N. Lon 20. 55

Friday Oct 14th 1878

This day begins with a lite breeze from
N. E. course S. by N. We are busy employed
Middle part lite air from all around
the compass later Calm and very hot
thermometer 86 in the shade so ends the day
work in Lat 8. 18 N

Saturday Oct 15 1878

This day begins with a Calm and
very hot the thermometer 86 in the
shade. We are employed in ships duty
later part lite air from S. E. course
& by N. Middle & later part Calm
and very hot. We busy employed
Turned in the fore Swifts we have not
made a mill the last 24 hours

New Bedford Thomas A. Hallett Master
Lays De Vera Islands to the South

Sunday Oct 16th 1878

This day begins with a Calm and very
hot Middle part the same later part
the air from N. E. course S. by N.
saw two Grampas so ends this day
work in Lat 8. 55 N. Lon 20. 28 W

Monday Oct 17th 1878

This day begins with lite air from the
Eastward course S. by N. at 3 P. M. had a squall
it blew first with rain. Middle part lite
air from Eastward later part same we are
employed in setting up the fore rigging from
the fore Swifts in a poor condition
the Sprocket Season all rotten and the
top Season when the Swifts goes over the
mast head all gone Nothing in sight
ends the days work Lat 7. 03 N. Long 20. 36 W

Tuesday Oct 18th 1878

This day begins with a lite breeze from the
Eastward course S. by N. Middle part lite breeze
and rain squalls later part. Saw a Barkentines
steaming to N. N. W. at 12 A. M. Wind began
to breeze up from S. E. ship by the wind
to S. E. by N. so ends the day Lat 6. 08 N. Long 21. 00

Wednesday Oct 19th 1878

This day begins with a fresh breeze from
S. E. ship by the wind to S. E. by N. saw one
sail Middle part lite air and Calm with
rain later part lite air from S. E. ship
by the wind to S. W. and sail in sight
the wind is unsteady with much rain
so ends the days work
Lat Long 21. 28 W
