Remarks on board of Ship Tiger of
West Coast of Africa

July 24 1879

This day begins with Calm and lite air
from N.W. Saw a shoal of porpoises
and Cow fish. We lowered the L. B. for
a Turtel at 8 A.M. lite air from S.W.
to S. Middle part course N. N. E. Calm and
lite air. Later Part same course N. E.
we are employed in ships duty so Ends this day
in Lat 9-55 S Long 10-38 E

July 25 1879

This day begins with Calm and lite air
from the S. to S.W. We are employed
in ships duty Middle part Lite air
from S. Course N. E. by E
Later Part Lite air from S. by E at 7 A.M.
Saw Sperm whales we lowered 4 boats
the L. B. got a whale so Ends this days work
in Lat 9-10 S Long 11-04 E

July 26 1879

This day begins with Calms and lite air
from S. S. W. We got the Whale along
side at 1 P.M. got through Cutting
in at 5 P.M. Course N. E. Middle Part
Calm later part we commence to boil out
the whale lite air from S. to S. E.
Lat 8-30 S Long 11-20 E

July 27 1879

This day begins with lite air from S. W.
course N. E. by E. We are Boiling oil
at 5 P.M. lite air from N. W. and
smoke over Cast and Misty and
thick. Middle part finish Boiling later
Part almost Calm the air from the E.
so Ends Lat 7-40 S Long 11-38 E

July 28 1879

This day begins with lite air from N. E.
and blows to N. & to N. W. later E. N. E.
at 4 P.M. got the Starboard Anchor
on the Iron Middle Part almost a Calm
later Part almost a Calm so Ends this
day Lat 6-45 S Long 10-12 E

July 29 1879

This day begins with lite air from N. W.
to S. S. W. We are running to N. N. W.
along the Land in 7 fathoms of
water saw a Schooner working
to the Southward at 5 P.M. saw a
Sail Anchor in shore of us and
had 2 boats down at 6 P.M. the Wind
died out to a Calm and lite air
later Part at day light got under
way and run down the Coast a
few Miles lite air and Slick & Mist
came to Anchor by the Bark Drake
she has taken three hundred barrels
of Humpback oil so Ends No observation

July 30 1879

This day begins with lite air from
the S. Wind to the S and overcast
and very Misty weather ship at
Anchor in 15 fathoms of water
Middle part lite air later Part at 6 A.M.
we got under way in Company with
the bark Drake and run down as
far as Congo River the Wind to
the Wind to Lite to Cross over so
we come to Anchor in 8
fathoms of water
so Ends this days work
