In the Harbour of St Helena

Sept 10th 1879

We are getting water port Watch on Liberty

Sept 11th 1879

Starboard Watch on Liberty

Sept 12 1879

Port Watch on Liberty

Sept 13th 1879

Starboard Watch on Liberty & the
Schooner Lottick heard come in
today

Sept 14th 1879

Port Watch on Liberty

Sept 15th 1879

Getting the ship stowed and getting
ready for sea we have discharged
the Cabin Boy Km J. Carter

Sept 16th 1879

Ship Nearly Ready for Sea

Sept 17th 1879

at 10 A.M. we got under way with a lite
air from S.E. but the air died out to
a calm we stowed anchor and chains
at 5 P.M. the Captain went on shore ship
Laying off and on

Sept 18th 1879

Ship Laying off and with a
Strong Breeze

Sept 20th 1879

at 2 P.M. we took our departure from the
Island of St Helena with a strong breeze
from S.E. we are steering N.W.
at 8 P.M. we steaming N.E. we now
sail for a thousand Barrels

Sept 21st 1879

Sea time 2-15 P.M. we took our departure
from St Helena we have a ship on board
from St Helena one by name of
Grafton Devine he is sick with a
sore throat so it has gathered and
done the middle part strong trade
wind ship by the wind to S.W. by S.
latter part wind the same at 10 P.M.
we were ship to E.N.E. we saw a
Large Bark so ends this day

Sept 22 1879

This day begins with Plenty breeze
from S.E. ship by the wind to
E.N.E. at 3 P.M. sight the Island
of St Helena bearing N.E. by E.
distance about 30 Miles off Middle
Part we are working to the S.E. trying
to get to the Island latter part
strong breeze ship under lower
topsails so ends

Sept 23

This day begins with a strong breeze
from S.E. ship under two topgallant sails
saw a sail ship by the wind tack and
tack middle part wind the same to
S.E. latter part at 8 P.M. the Captain and
the man that was sick with the sore
throat went ashore so ends this day
