Transactions on Tuesday ^{the} 19 April 1796

Begins Light southerly and easterly winds and the weather
very pleasant at 5 P.M. became calm and the tide
of Ebb which obliged us to anchor in 19 fathoms water
light house on Cape Henry bearing W 1/2 South 1/2 East 5 miles
Latter Part the wind came out from the NW and
gradually beted round to the Northward and from that
SE at 6 A.M. weighed our anchor and made sail
to endeavour to coast in at 10 Calm then bed it from the
the other Point mentioned before at Point Poff 18
got under way and Endeavored to run up Shaved NW 1/2
at 7 P.M. came up as far as Newport News and there
came to in 7 fathoms water Calm

Transactions on Wednesday the 20 April 98

Transactions on Wednesday 10th April 1791
Beginn Cohn at 5 P.M. hoist up the anchor and made
sail drifted up with the tide at 10 P.M. had a light air
from the SE saw several small craft and two shoon
and one sloop laden with Corn too 5 Miles above
Barnes City Island anchored in 24 fathoms water
the wind at N.W. Ends with Cohn

Transactions on Thursday the 21 April 1796

Begins Calm at 7 A.M. the tide of flood made weight and made sail light air from the Southeast at 1 P.M. the tide made against us and the wind held to W & E which occasioned us to come too soon 2 fathoms water to depth water for the tide at 1 P.M. the wind held to the S.E. & E. or E.S. weighed our anchor and made sail run up until we came within 3 miles of City Point there caught a ground which obliged us to ~~come~~ to carry out and anchor and weight for the tide at 10 P.M. got off and run up a midwater came to anchor in $\frac{1}{2}$ S of there

Transactions on Friday the 22 April 1796

Begins Cabin at 10 A.M. the tide made got under way
to Endeavour to get up the river at 2 P.M. Passed by ~~Little~~
Point at 5 P.M. Came to anchor about 4 Miles above the
flumheads went on shore and bought a half dollars worth of ~~the~~ ^{fish}
returned on board with the boat at 11 P.M. got under way and
towed up 17 or 18 Miles. The Cann too down

Transactions on Saturday 23 April 1796

Bigine taken at 6 P.M. had a moderate breeze from the E.S. at 10 P.M. got underway and endeavored to work up at 4 P.M. came too at Rockets in the fathom edies and lay the remainder of the twenty four hours

Transactions on Sunday ^{the} 24 April 1796

Dinner with Light SW winds and Cloudy at 5 P.M. went on shore at 10 returned at 1 P.M. weighed our anchors and went up to Branchiffert. Entered our report at 10 etc. Got Ballou Ballou out

Transactions Monday the 25th April 1879

Begins with a moderate breeze from the E & at 2 P.M.
 Begins to take our Coals in at 1 P.M. finished Lead & Emploding
 Sundries jobs.
