

Transactions on Tuesday 8 October 1793

Begins Moderate S.E. winds and Clear weather the Capt sent word on board to the mate to let go the out of doors if he would permit to obey the officers on board which he would not and Chop to be left in view the greatest part of the crew on shore latter part Begins calm at 9 a light breeze from S.E. and south the Capt came on board to have the said gope carried on shore to be put in Prison came to find out he had broke his Irons off and Begged forgiveness and promised to obey all commands which was necessary of the vessel which the Capt cleared at 10 both Capt went on shore at 11 had all the crew to come on board Ends

Transactions on Wednesday 9 October 1793

Begins Light S.W. winds and Pleas weather still in Rhode Island harbour waiting for orders Middle Part wind S.W. and Clear weather at 10 A.M. Frances Esboughs came on board who has been 7 or 8 days absent and Luis Rollard who has been three or three days absent without Liberty still lying at anchor

Transactions on Thursday 10 October 1793

Begins Moderate winds and Pleasant weather still lying at anchor Middle Part wind Light from S.W. the weather Clear one brig came in this day latter part Pleasant still lying at anchor had fresh Provisions sent on board several of the crew on shore on Liberty Ends

Transactions on Friday 11 October 1793

Begins Light winds and Clear weather at 6 P.M. the People returned latter part breezes light from S.W. had winds from New York which our orders is to come there with the vessel loose the sails and pulled them to the yards and hauled them back a Breeze of Wind came on board Wind S.W. & Pleasant weather Ends

Transactions on Saturday 12 October 1793

Begins the wind at S.W. and Cloudy at 1 P.M. the boat went on shore after fresh water had one of the sailors to lead her which was Bernard Debaugh at 4 the boat returned with the two Cask at 6 P.M. took the boat up Middle Part wind West of Frances Esboughs and Bernard Debaugh deserted this night when one of them had the watch with all their daring appeared at 6 P.M. sent the boat on shore to inform the Capt that the said sailors had run away got four Cask of water of this day had Rollard & Luis Denie the mate orders this day Ends

Transactions on Sunday 13 October 1793

Begins brisk winds and gradually hardening to the northward at 9 P.M. the wind at S.W. and brisk at 10 S.W. at 12 at light wind at 1 P.M. latter part wind freshened to the S.W. and more moderate at 4 P.M. sent the boat on shore to the Capt at 9 the boat returned on board the wind inclining to the Westward Ends
