

Transactions on Tuesday 2 July 1798

Begins light winds from the Northward and fog cleared.
Employed in Chasing Vodka Vicks. Latter Part
fog cleared at 10 A.M. the fog cleared and no whales
the Capt. caught under seals at 11 AM came on board
with the boat. Ends

Transactions on Wednesday 3 July 1798

Begins a light air but with at 3 P.M. our Consort Capt.
Raper saw two whales struck on and killed and anchored by
Latter fog cleared at 6 P.M. boat Vodka bay with all the
boats. Raper saw no whales went and sent ahead
to tea his along side of the friends came up bay with
our Larboard boat and Capt. Vodka last saw boat
after we came along side they informed us that this day
a whale had passed and went up bay with Capt. Briggs with
boat chased and struck which got very badly stove
and cut their line struck from our Larboard boat and
killed her took along side of Capt. Vodka
Capt. Sheffield and Capt. Vodka killed another one and
Anchored her. Ends

Transactions on Thursday 4 July 1798

Boat died from the Vodka at 4 P.M. and departed light
which obliged us to let go the left board anchor
Latter Part the winds from the N.E. and round to the S.W.
at 6 P.M. weighed out left board anchor and got it all clear
for to let it go Capt. Briggs weighed and went down to
the whale that was anchored and cut her in vent of and reached
bay but saw nothing around. Capt. George Clark came from
detached by getting the whale in vent of the bay

Transactions on Friday 5 July 1798

Begins a light breeze from the Northward and gradually
freshening to the S.W. at 2 P.M. a fresh air wind and light
drifted let go the left board anchor and brought her up
Latter Part winds more moderate drift of with all boats
our Capt. saw a whale which he struck and killed
employed in tending and another whale which our Consort boat
chased but could not strike

Transactions on Saturday 6 July 1798

Begins a light air from the Northward at 2 P.M. took the
the whale along side of the boat at 4 weighed out left
board anchor and got it all clear for to let it go
got all clear for to hook on the whale
Latter Part light air from the N.E. and clear Capt. Sheffield
Capt. Vodka came on board to cut the whale out of the boat
saw one whale which he chased but could not strike
