head a head weighed and made all standing sail at 9
saw a right whale from the S. friends went of with
the starboard boat and chased with the other boats
without success the boats returned ends in plying
to windward

Transactions on Monday 17 June 1793

Begins a brisk breeze and clear took in topgallant
sails at 3 P.M. took a single reef in main top sail took
in gill at 5 came too on the S. side in 15 fathoms
of water with the best border anchored at 10 P.M. calm

Letter Part light wind from the S.W. and S.W. by S. gradually
breezing round to the S.W. and S.W. by S. gradually
at 7 A.M. made short on purpose to run up bay
but saw several right whale on the S. side soon
boats and chased Capt. Johnson struck a cow which
he killed that had a calf Capt. S. and I struck on
which took the Iron Ends in chasing

Transactions on Monday 18 June 1793

Begins light S.W. wind and clear at 3 P.M. returned
on board Capt. Johnson weighed and went to his whale with
his ship Letter the wind held round to the S.W. at 6 P.M.
made up and made all standing sail to run
up bay and to go on the S. side

At 11 A.M. saw a whale Capt. Briggs and Capt. S. followed
went after her chased without success at 11 o'clock came
too in 9 fathoms of water with the
small border anchored

Transactions on Wednesday 19 June 1793

Begins light S.W. wind and clear weather
at 3 P.M. went on shore a fishing caught a mips of fish
at 5 returned on board Letter Part light wind from the
S.W. took in all boats and went up bay saw a cow and calf which
did strike from our starboard boat and two other boats from
our consort struck the same whale which two of us ran for
which occasioned us to cut which the whale run very far down
bay before they killed her took along side of Capt. Johnson
returned on board ends

Transactions on Thursday 20 June 1793

Begins moderate S.W. wind and clear Letter Part wind
S.W. and some fog till daylight the Capt. made down bay
the whale reached up bay saw a cow and calf which our consort
struck fastened from our starboard boat which he killed
took her along side of the harmony Capt. Briggs went off with
two of the starboard boats saw several whales struck from our
starboard boat and killed her employed in tending our consort
Capt. Johnson killed another whale this day
