

Transactions on Sunday 2 June 1793

Begins Light WSW breeze at 12. PM the Starboard Boat came on board and finished starting down our Latter Part Light Ears and fog and several right whales and three killed by other shipping in the bay on board and only killed Males with Capt Wilcox's boat and Capt Benjamin's.

Transactions on Monday 3 June 1793

Begins Light N Wind and Clear weather Latter Part Moderate breeze from the Northward and clear went with the Starboard boat up bay and a right whale which Mr Pinkern struck and killed took her along side of the Capt's boat.

Transactions on Tuesday 4 June 1793

Begins Calm at 4 PM the wind from the Eastward at 5 PM wind from the Northward the Capt's boat came in saw several right whales killed by Capt's Males Latter Part Moderate Breezes from the Northward and gradually backing to the SW went out bay with the Starboard boat. Road away to windward and two whales chased without success and a lone whale which we paddled on and struck from our Starboard boat which we killed then had three more cracked badly so that obliged us to drop a strong boat which they threw and picked us up. Turned our boat up and stopped in Lake. Left two oars the Males struck and did not obey his commands in the boat when fast to a whale.

Transactions on Wednesday 5 June 1793

Begins a brisk SW breeze and heavy at 4 PM. returned on board took the boat in to repair. Latter Part Light Breezes and fog attended went in the bay with our two boats the other boat went out to the head whale but saw another and killed her and towed her in along side of the Mary Capt's Boat. Towed from the Starboard boat but did not capture several whales. been seen this day the Capt's was under the necessity of flogging the Stevedore the Stevedore for not Obeying his Commands - Ends.

Transactions on Thursday 6 June 1793

Begins Light N Wind and Clear weather Latter Part Light Ears and fog attended went out bay with the Starboard boat and several whales struck one from our Starboard boat and killed her. Ends in Rowing.

Transaction on Friday 7 June 1793

Begins Light WSW breeze and fog at 1 PM. Chase at 3 PM. took the whale along side of Capt's Briggs. Capt's boat struck another but his own died and the other Middle Port Calm & Latter at 4 PM went out with all the boats Capt's Males saw a whale which we struck and killed. Ends in.
