

Transactions on Monday 6 May 1793

Begins a light NW breeze and clear weather at 1 P.M. the Capt took the boats crew and three lines and went on shore to lay them together but there was nothing ready returned as he went at 3 P.M. Calm at 6 had a light air from the SSE Middle Part Little or no wind

After Part Light Air from the Westward at 11 P.M. had a light air from the SE had short but the wind was so light that our Capt thought proper to not weigh at 9 Calm at 10 had a breeze from the NW the Capt went on shore to hunting for Deer skin there but set so near as to kill them at 11 returned on board sent one boat on shore after broom brush &c

Transactions on Tuesday 7 April May 1793

Begins a light westerly wind and clear weather the Capt went up bay a shooting at 4 P.M. returned with two Pelicans & the other boat had returned with a great plenty of Porush for brooms at 11 the Starboard boat went on shore a scanning

After Part begins Calm and a large swell from the Westward at 2 P.M. the boat returned on board with a great plenty of fish & with a light wind to get out the end

Transactions on Wednesday 8 May 1793

at 1 P.M. had a light air of wind from the SE had short and weighed anchor to beat up to go out had the wind to back to the NW which obliged us to come too again with the small anchor

After Part Light wind from the SE had short and fog attended at 3 P.M. wind at 6 P.M. wind at 8 P.M. but thick with fog however and weighed anchor and cut were raised by jingling of the fog rather cleared up and the wind more moderate set the topmast and lower shrou to starboard forwards sent the main top gal. Mast royal a loft bent it and set it bent the middle stay sail at 9 P.M. had the wind half past to the Northward took in the Shear sails got both boats a head at 10 had the wind to breeze from the SE came along side with the boats and took them up Ends with the weather more clear took the large anchor the palms of in board and coiled the large cable down took the small anchor on the ground Ends

Transactions on Thursday 9 May 1793

Begins a light air from the SE and the weather clear at 4 P.M. the Enteron of Valdivia bay bore E by S by Compass 4 Leagues off shore from which I take my Departure Bound off the wind gradual backing to the westward at 3 locked large Dip. SEW and NW at 7 the wind backed to the SW and gradually increasing After Part pleasant breezes and a large swell from the Westward at 8 P.M. got the fore top gallant mast clear for to send aloft sent it up sent fore top gallant sail and royal aloft set them steered from 1 P.M. until 10 P.M. the wind from SE at 10 32 44 South Longitude in 17 00 East
