

Transactions on Friday 26 April 1793

Begins a moderate breeze from SE and gradually backing to the southward and increasing at 2 P.M. finished scraping the sides sent a boat and even on shore after the Captⁿ at 3 the boat returned with the Captⁿ at 4 P.M. had the wind from the SE at 9 at SE and squally at 11 took the spare boat and went on shore evening for fish but caught but few lightning struck latter part the winds at SE and SE at 2 P.M. the boat returned at 2 P.M. hove up our left corner anchor to see if it was clear let go the small one called and fished the other one had it all clear for to let go if occasion required at 9 the two Captⁿs went ashore at 1 P.M. finished the jibboom on bent the jib and rigged the other one in put the boom but bent a new jib finished the main top gallant sail and bent it to the yard so ends

Transactions on Saturday 27 April 1793

Begins a light easterly wind and flying clouds at 1 P.M. went on shore to the island at the harbor mouth with the starboard boat at 3 P.M. returned with some eggs and penguins latter part the shift to the Northward at 9 P.M. the starboard boat went to the island went up eggs at 10 P.M. had some light rain and cloudy weather waiting for an opportunity to pay our respects to the

Transactions on Sunday 28 April 1793

Begins with a light easterly wind and gradually backing to the Westward at 3 Calm the spare boat returned with a ^{few} fish the Captⁿ went on shore at 6 P.M. returned on board Middle Part Calm latter begins Calm at 2 P.M. the waist boat went on shore with the same after fish at 3 P.M. returned on board with very few fish at 9 P.M. the Captⁿ went on shore with Captⁿ Briggs Employed in filling water to heal our vessel to day her bends at 11 finish paying the starboard side and began to paint it finished but on Mid. So Ends with fog

Transactions on Monday 29 August 1793

Begins a light breeze from South and thick with fog Middle Part much the same latter part the fog cleared at 2 P.M. the boat went on shore evening at 2 returned with very few fish Employed in painting the vessel round at 10 P.M. the boat went on shore after the Captⁿ

Transactions on Tuesday 30 August 1793

Begins moderate breezes from the southward at 1 P.M. finished painting the vessel sides at 4 P.M. the Captⁿ returned on board latter part light easterly breezes at 3 P.M. the waist boat went on shore a fishing for one of the people had a sword fish to run his tail into his feet which occasioned them to turn with sword fish at 8 P.M. the ship hove in and the ship hove in and the ship hove in as that they had not seen any whales Employed in scraping down our top masts and cutting a hole through the stem to raise a scuppers to get the
