Begins a Moderate breeze and Pleasant weather at 1 P.M. tacked and stood to the westward at 12 at Light tacked and stood in latter Part the Sailing to the Westward at 2 tacked and stood off at 6 P.M. the wind favoured tacked and stood in to the South and East and a Lamb of Gannets and of Gulls and but very few baglets

Sailed by Observe 33.03 South

Transactions on Saturday 20 April 1793

Begins a light wind from the SE but still standing in for the bay at 4 P.M. the wind held to the WSW the wind being light found that we could not go in baled of by the wind to the SE at 7 P.M. tacked the wind held to the SW stood off at 11 tacked and stood in by the wind latter Part had the wind at WSW tacked and stood off to the Westward until 3 P.M. tacked and stood in by the wind at 5 P.M. had it foggy at 9 tacked and stood off wind South at half after 9 stood on to the SE with foggy at 11 tacked and stood off Ends foggy

Transactions on Sunday 21 April 1793

Begins with fog at 1 P.M. the fog cleared to the Westward saw the Brothers to the westward and Northward tacked and stood in towards the Land at 2 the Partisan was sharing sail to star board at 3 P.M. came in so near the Land that we could see that we had felt to seaward of the bay took in the sharing sail at 4 tacked and stood off at 5 stood in at 6 stood off until 10 tacked and stood in at 12 tacked and stood off until 6 tacked and stood in for the Land saw that we had drifted with Current to seaward bore up for the Land or the Calenoisiers at 1 P.M. came up with them however the Capt^m went on shore wind SW

Transactions on Monday 22 April 1793

Begins a fine increasing gale from the SW soundest of the Calenoisiers when they bore SE but the Mild Distance had 18 fathoms of water rocky bottom at 2 the Capt^m came on board with pin quins and eggs a few of each bore up for the bellers bay heard from the Calenoisiers rocks SE to the North East Point

Begins Moderate breeze and a large swell from the WSW saw one large Calico saw a number of Gulls and albatrosses and baglets stood to the SE as long as we had the moon at 12 tacked headed to the SE latter the wind at SW and gradually hawling to the SE at 6 P.M. bore up to the SE at 8 P.M. saw the Land bearing SE at 12 distance 12 or 13 leagues at 1 saw a ship within us standing off at Inver spoke with her Capt^m David McIn from Dunkirk the Brothers be informed us that he had seen three ships but of what kind could not tell standing in 12 P.M. at 12 o'clock the Entrance of Soleno bore SE or SE by E

Sailed Observed in 33.08 and 33.10 and 33.13
