Captain Jacob weighed and sailed from the Whippings from the Rhode Island latter Part the wind gradually increased at 8, A.M. the Capt. went with one boat on shore to trade for hogs and goats but there being no good hogs that he could not buy any goats and one sheep as Mrd returned on board 6.
