

Transactions on Wednesday the 6 February 1793
begins a brisk breeze from E.W. at 1 P.M. began to have
a head to get under way hove in 6 or 8 fathoms of the
cable the anchor being foul which it tripped it and
drifted in towards the Land occasioned us to let go our
best bower anchor and brought her up hove the small one
up and got it clear hove upon the other one took the
stream anchor in one of the boats and bent a tendon to
it and streamed it to windward weighed the best bower anchor
and it became calm haled off let go the small anchor. weigh-
ed the stream anchor casted the other at 3 the Capt. went
on shore but found that there was no stock came returned on
board caught several small fish hove it calm latter
Part begins with a calm at 7 P.M. hove a light breeze from
the E.W. weighed our anchor and made all sail put the three
boats a head to tow the wind gradually hauling round to the
Southward at 10 let the boats come along side took them up
at Mid well to the Southward and northward of the Island

Transactions on Thursday the 7 February 1793
begins a light breeze from the Northward at 2 P.M. took the
wind at 2 E.S.E. & 3 S.E. at 4 P.M. took the anchors in board
at 6 the Island bore North Distance 8 leagues haled our main
for the use of my Steers as W. Cotton
set all Trawling sail latter Part winds
Moderate the weather more thick
Employed in warming of cable when its
badly chafed and other duties of the ship
at 10 saw a pinback whale which the Capt.
shot a musket boat in at Mid saw the
breachers from the Edge to the Northward of the
Island which broke badly which bore South
when we made them latter by 15th 24th 10th

sails at Starboard and Port at 5 saw two brigs lying at anchor
in the harbor saw 10 gags as the sun fell to the Westward
of it at 6 P.M. came in to anchor where the two brigs lay
one of them belonged in Rhode Island another the other in Long
a frenchman anchored in 15 fathoms of water with the small
bower anchor at 6 P.M. the Capt. went on board of the
American brig at 8 returned on board latter Part begins
Moderate gales and clear weather at 8 P.M. the boat went
on shore with the Capt. the boat returned directly on board
at 9 took up our provisions from between decks at 10 there
came fresh floods of the Land which our vessel drifted of the
bank clear away for head a head got out anchor to the
bough out the two top sails for stay sail and Gib hals the
the try sail out and Beat in let go the small bower
anchor in 10 fathoms of water a hauled the sail and got off
clear for to stow our provisions down so ends
