Transaction on Sunday the 3rd February 1793
 Begins a fine leading wind and
 heavy weather at 6 P.M. shortened sail
 Single reef the top sail headed to the North
 ward at 11 more ship and headed
 to the Southward Letter Part a
 fine leading wind at 4 A.M. set sail
 up our helm and steered as per Column
 at 7 A.M. saw the Island of St. Louis
 bearing SE W 1/2 S 3 leagues: bore our
 cables at 11 came under the
 lee of the Island had it calm and
 flatter Day saw that the Island was
 dry green having one of the belts to break
 that in the night the rough sea
 and the other belt to break

Transactions on Monday the 4th February 1793
 Begins Light Dis air and variable the wind from
 SW to NW at 10 the Capt went on shore to see if he
 could find the harbour but could not find the bay
 hour nor any body to inform him so returned on board
 at 4 P.M. saw a man on the beach waving the Capt
 took a boat and crew and went on shore the man
 returned with the Capt he informed us that there was
 plenty of stock and fruit to be had have not mind
 a reef to go in so held off by the wind at 12 at high
 got so left to the land down with one of the boats
 and towed of shore had small breeze from the SE
 at 6 A.M. took ship and stood in have the wind variable
 and calm at 11 came to anchor in 11 fathoms of water with
 St. Lucia bearing NW 1/2 W

 at 1 P.M. the Capt went on shore at 4 P.M. returned on
 board caught several small fish Letter Part the wind
 of the land at 2 have it in squalls at 6 P.M. more moder

 but had nothing but fruit came at 11 the Capt
 came on board without any bag or goats Observed in
 Letter Part the latitude
