these 24 hours Commences with very light winds from the Eastward and pleasant at 5 P.m. the Starboard Boat Come on board led lost side of the other boats at 1 a.m. the others Come to the ship light part gentle breezes from the South & Lat 36. 00 N Long 41. 48 W

Tuesday

these 24 hours Commences with gentle breezes from the South and Eastward and pleasant weather latter part gentle breezes from the Eastward and pleasant weather latter the same two sails in sight to day Lat 36. 19 N Long 41. 20 W

Wednesday

these 24 hours Commences with gentle breezes from the Eastward and pleasant weather middle part strong winds from the Eastward latter part the same nothing in sight Lat 36. 37 N Long 41. 23 W

Thursday

these 24 hours Commences with strong winds from the Eastward and rough middle part light winds from the Eastward and pleasant latter part the same at 7 a.m. saw sperm whales lands the boats the Starboard Boat got lost at 10 a.m. and the iron cage out so ends Lat 35. 45 N Long 42. 00 W

Friday

these 24 hours Commences with light winds from the Eastward the boats off Chase at 2 P.m. the Starboard Boat got lost and killed the whale at 6 P.m. took the whale along side middle part calm latter part light winds from the West at 12 midday got three Culling Lat 36. 45 N Long 41. 58 W

these 24 hours Commences with light winds from Westward one sail in sight to day middle part squally and some rain latter part light up at 10 a.m. spoke the bark Sarah of Madril Capt King had lost took a whale along side so ends these 24 hours Lat 35. 39 N Long 42. 04 W

Sunday

these 24 hours Commences with strong winds from the Westward and pleasant weather middle part light winds from the West and some squally latter part the same one sail in sight to day seems to be the same Lat 35. 30 N Long 42. 04 W

July

Monday

these 24 hours Commences with light winds from the West and pleasant with one sail in sight middle part light winds from the West and some light squalls of rain latter part the same one sail in sight to day stopping down the air Lat 35. 28 N Long 42. 12 W

Tuesday

these 24 hours Commences with calm storming down of one sail in sight to day middle part light winds from the South and Westward latter part the same saw black fish two sails in sight to day so ends Lat 35. 32 N Long 42. 20 W

Wednesday

these 24 hours Commences with light winds from the South and Westward middle part light winds all around the compass two sails in sight Lat 35. 47 N Long 42. 31 W

Thursday

these 24 hours Commences with light winds from the West and Westward middle part light winds latter part the same saw boats Chasing a whale so ends these 24 hours Lat 36. 06 N Long 42. 46 W
