Wednesday 16 these 26 hours Commences with strong winds from the north and very rugged weather. Catching the whale at 7 Pm got them and went to Bayling middle part very rugged with latter part the same off to the S W of Fayal so Ends

Thursday 17

these 26 hours Commences with strong winds from the north off to the S W of Fayal at 4 Pm saw several whales seen the boats but did not get last middle part very squally and blowing heavy latter part the same blowing so Ends

Friday 18

these 26 hours Commences with strong winds from the north and very rugged weather off to the S W of Fayal middle part the same latter part strong winds from the north so Ends these 26 hours

Saturday 19

these 26 hours Commences with strong winds from the north off to the North west of Fayal middle part like winds from the westward latter part strong winds from the westward impropable in passing air off to the west of Fayal so Ends

Sunday 20

these 26 hours Commences with strong winds from the Eastward and rugged middle part the same latter the winds from the north and westward depending so Ends these of the west point of Fayal so the 26 hr

Monday 21

these 26 hours Commences with strong winds from the north and westward middle part the winds from the Eastward latter part the same off to west of Fayal so Ends these 26 hours

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Tuesday 22

these 26 hours Commences with like winds from the Eastward middle part the winds from the north and westward and squally and rugged latter part the winds from the north and west and blowing hard and rainy weather muddiness between Fayal and Pico so Ends

Wednesday 23

these 26 hours Commences with the winds from the South west at 4 Pm the winds shifted to the north and blew very hard till 6 Pm moderated middle part quite pleasant latter part the same stood in for Fayal town at 10 am landed the oil off to town so Ends

Thursday 24

these 26 hours Commences with strong winds from the north and pleasant at 4 Pm came on board landed out about west and sent East then the day so Ends 26 hours

Friday 25

these 26 hours Commences with gentle winds from the Eastward and thick weather some squalls of rain middle part strong winds from the Eastward and a heavy swell on latter part the same sailing in sight to day so Ends these 26 hr  
Lat 35° 52' N Long 26° 16' 30" W

Saturday 26

these 26 hours Commences with strong winds from the north and Eastward and rugged weather sailing sight to day middle part strong winds from the north and Eastward and latter part the same so Ends these 26 hours  
Lat 34° 48' N Long 26° 46' W

Sunday 27

these 26 hours Commences with strong winds from the north and Eastward at 3 Pm boarded the French bark Francis Joseph of Lorient Discharged Capt. asked me to stay by him then the cable he so in the morning let him have 3
