January 1 these 24 hours Commences with lite winds from the North and Eastward and pleasant weather nothing in site middle part the breezes from the Eastward and pleasant weather latter part the same so ends
Lat 19. 28 S Long 37. 06 W

Thurs 2 these 24 hours Commences with the winds from the South and Eastward and pleasant middle part strong winds from the North and Eastward and squally latter part some squalls of rain so ends these 24 hours one sail in sight
Lat 20. 30 S Long 36. 00 W

Fridy 3 these 24 hours Commences with strong winds from the North and Eastward and squally and raining with one sail in sight to day middle part squally latter part strong winds and squalls of rain thick weather so ends
Lat 21. 16 S Long 36. 00 W

Sath 4 these 24 hours Commences with from the Eastward and rage with one sail middle part raining with latter part the same squall and rage with nothing in sight to day so ends the
Lat 22. 30 S Long 36. 00 W

Sundy 5 these 24 hours Commences with strong winds from the North and Eastward raining to day all day middle part strong winds from the North and squally with latter part the same some rain and rage with so ends these 24 hours
Lat 23. 40 S Long 35. 45 W

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January 6 these 24 hours Commences with strong winds from the North and squally and raining with middle part strong winds from the North and Eastward latter part the same so ends
Lat 23. 00 S Long 36. 30 W

Sunday 7 these 24 hours Commences with strong winds from the North and Eastward and rage and raining with thick and squally middle part strong winds from the South west and raining latter part the winds from the South west and pleasant with nothing in sight to day
Lat 23. 02 S Long 37. 04 W

Tuesday 8 these 24 hours Commences with strong winds from the South west and pleasant with nothing in sight to day middle part strong winds from the South and westward latter part the same saw one sail going to the North
Lat 23. 15 S Long 37. 27 W

Thursday 9 these 24 hours Commences with lite winds from the South and westward and pleasant with one sail in sight middle part lite winds from the South and westward and pleasant latter part the same three sails in sight to day so ends these 24 hours
Lat 23. 12 S Long 37. 57 W

Friday 10 these 24 hours Commences with lite winds from the South and westward and pleasant with three sails in sight to day steering to the westward middle part the winds from the South and Eastward and pleasant with latter part the same at 8 am spoke the Bank St R Tucker Capt Ginnell 170 barrels of oil so ends these 24 hours
