

Journal of Voyage kept on board Ship Tharong

Thursday June 13 1844

Fresh breeze from the Westward Cruising at 10 last
sight spoke the Isaac Howland 11 months out 1900
at 1 1/2 pm spoke the Mentor of Newport 32 months out
200 of Spermaceti and 30 Whales at 11 1/2 pm lowered
for Whales but got none 5 Seals in sight
Some chasing Whales

Friday June 14

Light winds from the Westward Cruising at
10 AM lowered for Whales but got none at 6 PM
spoke the Eagle of Fairhaven 12 months out 500
Capt Perry

Saturday June 15

Calm foggy weather Ambient the Perseus
repaired and sent it again at 2 PM lowered
for Whales in company with the Eagle got none
the Captain went on board the Eagle

Sunday June 16

Light winds from the Eastward Cruising Thick fog
Spoke the Concord of New Bedford Capt Topham
11 months out 1300 of Whale Oil

Monday June 17

Light winds from the Eastward at 7 PM lowered
for Whales without success at 9 PM lowered again
but got nothing spoke the Electra of New London
12 months out 1300 3 Seals in sight one of
them it eating in

Thin Rain Cruising on the 14th of June 1844

Tuesday June 18

Light winds and moderate weather at 10 AM lowered for Whales
but did not get on at 1 1/2 lowered again the Bow boat struck
and drove the gun at 4 PM lowered again the West
boat fastened and the Captain out from ship
Spoke the Ephraim of New Bedford 25 months out
400 of Spermaceti and 80 of Whales sawed ships in sight
Whaling Lat 55.13 N

Wednesday June 19

Fresh breeze from the Northward at 8 AM lowered
for Whales the larboard went on but did not get
lost through some mismanagement later part
foggy 1 ship in sight cutting 3 more seals in sight

Thursday June 20

Light winds from the Northward and Eastward
at 2 PM lowered for Whales without success
1 Seal in sight

Friday June 21

Light winds from the S.W. steering by the wind
at 1 PM lowered for Whales but did not get on
at 6 1/2 PM lowered again the Bow boat went on
but did not get first as the Whale settled
4 seals in sight 2 of them boiling

Saturday June 22

Fresh gales from the Eastward Cruising lowered
for Whales at 1 PM the bow struck and parted
at 10 PM lowered again without success at
11 lowered again fastened with two boats
killed and took him along side boarded the Dolphin of N. York
lowered 9 months out 1100 lbs of oil
