Wednesday May 30

Pleasant weather I worked on Liberty Ship
Carpenter and 1 other man

Thursday May 31

Light winds with frequent squalls of rain
watch on Liberty got a load of Hops
and 2 men deserted to day

Friday June 1

Fine weather the watch came on board this
morning got of the Starboard and Waist boats
all hands employed in getting ready for Sea

Saturday June 2

Light winds and fine weather called all
hands at day-light and have short
and some got under way 2 men deserted
last night by swimming ashore the Consul
took another on shore for threatening the
Capt left at 10.15m discharged the Pilot
at 12 Part of the Boatsteerers ashore
and stowed the anchors and left Port with a
recruit of 600 gallons of Hops 300 lbs of water
at 6.15m raised Spanish wheels and lower
of 2 boats but did not get on

Ship Sharon of Fair Haven off the Navigators

Tuesday June 3rd 1848

Light winds and squalls of rain cruising Opoto and
Bootoowillo Nothing in sight

Monday June 4

Fresh trade, cruising of Opoto the Capt went on shore
on the South side of Opoto and struck 3 men

Tuesday June 5

Fresh trade, cruising off and on the South side
of Opoto the Captain went on shore to get some
the men Cloutier at 9.15m saw a large Sperm
Whale 3000 within 1 mile of the Ship but
did not lower for them as the Captain
was at going on shore

Wednesday June 6

Moderate trade and fine weather cruising
off the Navigators took in the Bow boat and
pointed her Opoto and Bootoowillo in sight

Thursday June 7

Fresh trade, cruising off the weather End of
Opoto Saw a Barque standing in for Opoto

Friday June 8

Fresh trade, beating up from Opoto to Bootoowillo
put the Bow boat and turned up the Starboard
boat to Point

Saturday June 9

Moderate trade, cruising of Bootoowillo bearing
S dist 15 miles
