

Journal of A Whaling Voyage kept on board

Monday April 24

Light winds from the Eastward steering by the Wind. Called all hands at daylight and out in our other whale and commenced trying out Oil in sight

Tuesday April 25

Light winds from the Eastward steering North under all sail. Finished trying out at noon

Wednesday April 26

Light winds from the Eastward steering N. E. under all sail. Employed in tearing down and mending the Fly jib

Thursday April 27

Fresh gales from E. S. E. steering N. E. under all sail until 5 P.M. when we took in sail to double reefed topsails. The Watch employed in turning down rigging

Friday April 28

Fresh gales from the Eastward steering N. E. steering. Employed in tearing down. At 12^o raised Spruce Masts and lowered 3 boats for the foreboard Boat struck and killed at 1 P.M. took him along side

Saturday April 29

Moderate winds from the Eastward called all hands at daylight and commenced setting in get through at 10 A.M. and commenced trying out at 11 A.M. Surprised the land Whale one of the Navigators

Sunday April 30

Variable winds and heavy squalls of rain. finished trying out at 3 last night. A number of the Navigators in sight

Monday May 1

Fresh gales from the Southward steering by the Tacking and Keels at 6 P.M. spoke the Ship Equisly Morgan of New Bedford 13 months out 350 lbs of Sperm Oil. One of the Navigators in sight dist at sunset 10 miles

Tuesday May 2

Light variable winds. Laying off and on the Island of the boat went on shore and got 1 Hog and a few Coconuts and a few Coconuts at 5 P.M. killed the Hog

Wednesday May 3

Light winds from the Eastward laying off and on. 2 Boats went on shore to trade for Hogs and eggs and got 2 Hogs 2 eggs Coconuts &c
