

Our boys 4 in number were knocked in the head and
 thrown overboard after shot was made and the blood
 washed from the ship & search was made for the
 other Tomoka and he was soon found on the fore
 board between the fore and main masts
 and after some resistance he was got on deck
 and handcuffs put on to him and chained to
 a ringbolt. It appears by his account that when
 he came aft and saw the other natives that
 he went and jumped overboard and swam away
 from the ship at being calmed and after the boats
 were hoisted up he got hold of the eyebolt in the
 truster and being by it things got still on deck and
 them came and got on deck by the ladders
 and went down into the fore hold &c

 Monday November 2
 Fresh breeze from W to N E driving S by E at 6 AM
 broke out for top and deck but 4:50 AM long 16:12
 Thursday November 3
 Pleasant breeze from the Northward steering S by E
 Sat 3:24 North long 16:45 East
 Friday November 4
 Light breeze from the Eastward steering by the wind
 following in sight Sat 2:28 North long 16:20 East
 Saturday November 5
 Breeze from the Northward steering S by E
 Sunday November 6
 These 4 natives sighted at 10 AM and within 15 minutes
 landed on the beach and speaking the language of 8 or 10 in sound
 the Captain who had right he has just said it spoken in the little
 and 7 brought from the natives took and examined them to the
 deck and examined of the back of it got all said and
 and washed the blood from off the deck and the
 Captain's At 1 PM broke out between decks to search for
 the other natives and he was discovered between the fore
 and main masts and was ordered on deck but
 refused and began to throw water after a short time
 he was got up and sent in chains and chained to a ringbolt
 Sat by 10:20 North long 16:15 East
 Monday November 7
 Pleasant breeze from E by S to S by E & W
