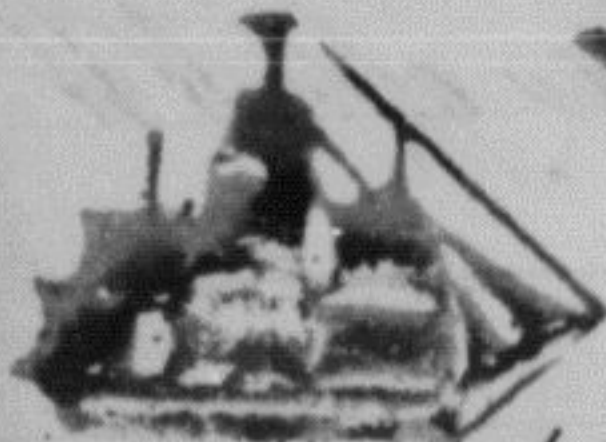


Journal of a Whaling Voyage Kept on board

Wednesday June 15th 1842

These 24 hours light winds from the ESE and calm
At 6 AM saw Pleasant Island bearing SSW dist
36 miles at 7 $\frac{1}{2}$ Saw Sperm Whales and put off after
them the Waist boat got 3 the bow boat struck
twice and drew; at sunset got them along side



Thursday June 16th

Light winds from the ESE to SSE at 8 AM
Commenced cutting in at 6 PM finished and
Commenced Boiling Several Canoes came off to trade
Saw 1 sail to the Eastward



Friday June 17

These 24 hours light winds from the Eastward
Cruising to the NE of Pleasant Island 1 sail
in sight Boiling out Broke out for water

Saturday June 18

Light winds from the Eastward cruising to the
NE of Pleasant Island Several Canoes came off
to trade 1 sail in sight Boiling out



Sunday June 19

Light winds from the Eastward finished Boiling
at daylight Pleasant in sight to the Westward
Saw 2 Sails



Monday June 20

Light winds from the Eastward cruising to the
NE of Pleasant Island Saw 1 sail

Ship Sharon of Fair Haven Capt. Norris on the Line

Tuesday June 21st 1842

Light winds from the Eastward cruising to
the NE of Pleasant Island stored down our
oil 10 1 Bls Saw Kumpers

Wednesday June 22

Light winds from the Eastward Cruising to
the NE of Pleasant Island Saw Nothing

Thursday June 23

Light winds from the ENE cruising off Pleasant
Island Saw 2 Sails 1 Barge and Brig

Friday June 24

Light winds from the Eastward cruising off the Island
1 sail in sight

Saturday June 25

Light winds from the ESE cruising off Pleasant
Island 2 Sails in sight Saw Grampuses

Sunday June 26

Light winds from the ESE and calm steering
by the wind to the Eastward 2 Sails in sight
Saw 1 Dead Whale Sat 10:00 Long 16 S. 15

Monday June 27

Light winds from the Northward steering
ESE under all sail 1 sail in sight Sat 28 Long 16 S. 50

Tuesday June 28

Light winds and calm steering by the wind 1 sail
in sight Sat 29 Long 16 S. 50
