

Journal of a Voyage kept on board Ship

Friday January 21st 1842
 Light winds from the Eastward Coaled all hands at daylight and commenced cutting our Whales at 11 AM got them cut in and started the tryworks at 4 PM raised Sperm Whales and lowered 3 Boats the Waist Boat missed it got nothing
 Lat 30° 30' Long 169° 05'

Saturday January 22
 Light winds from the ENE steering by the wind Tying out spoke the Governor Wilcott of Saliney 24 months out 1000 Bbls of Sperm oil lat 30° 20' long 168° 58'

Sunday January 23
 Fresh gales from the NE steering by the wind finished tying out at 6 AM saw 1 sail
 Saw Blackfish Lat 30° 10' Long 168° 35'

Monday January 24
 A stiff breeze from the NE steering by the wind Saw 2 sails Lat 29° 47' Long 168° 35'

Tuesday January 25
 A stiff breeze from the NE steering by the wind at 8 AM Saw Sperm Whales but they went to the windward and lost sight of them 168° 50' 35' Lat

Wednesday January 26
 A stiff breeze from the NE steering by the wind stowed down our Oil 14 Bbls to day at 4 PM raised Sperm Whales and lowered 4 Boats for them and got 4 Whales and took them all day at 9 o'clock at night Lat 165° 30' 35' Lat 166° 35'

Sharon of Fair Haven Capt Harris, Pacific Ocean

Thursday January 27th 1842
 Light winds from the Eastward coaled all hands at daylight and commenced cutting our Whales and got them cut in at noon and started the tryworks

Friday January 28
 Fresh winds from the Northward steering by the wind finished Tying at 6 PM Very raining
 Lat 30° 35' South Long 167° 35'

Saturday January 29
 A fresh gale from the NE steering by the wind Saw 1 sail standing to the Westward
 Lat 30° 37' South Long 167° 20' East

Sunday January 30
 A stiff breeze from the NE cruising between Pleasant and Ceran Islands Saw Nothing
 Lat 30° 03' South Long 167° 45' East

Monday January 31st
 A moderate breeze from the NE cruising between Pleasant and Ceran Islands Nothing in sight
 Stowed down our Oil 70 Bbls to day Lat 30° 03' Long 168° 00'

Tuesday February 1st 1842
 Very raining with a light breeze from the Northward steering by the wind Nothing in sight

Wednesday February 2
 A light breeze from the NE steering by the wind at 11 AM raised Sperm Whales
 Lat 30° 35' South Long 167° 35'
