and lowered for them but saw them no more

by the wind Saw nothing Altered the Fore
topgallant sail Set Quarter watches

Saturday January 15
A moderate breeze from the N.E. steering
by the wind Lat 0:10 Long 169:10

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The ship of Fair Haven Capt. Morris Pacific Ocean

at 11 A.M. raised Sperm Whales and lowered
the Boats for them and the Mate Gallied them
and we got none at 3 P.M. lowered for another
Shovel but saw them no more

Sunday January 16
Light winds from the Northward Cruising
to the Eastward of Pleasant Island it
bearing S.W. at noon Dist 23 miles
Saw Blackfish Lat 1:9 Long 167:22

Monday January 17
Light winds and calms cruising to the N.E.
of Pleasant Island 5 Canoes came off this
Afternoon bringing Hats and Shells to trade
for tobacco Lat 00:13 Long 16

Tuesday January 18
Light winds and calms cruising to the N.E.
of Pleasant Island 16 Canoes came off
to the Ship bringing Hats Shells fowl
and 3 Hogs to trade for Tobacco

Wednesday January 19
Light winds from S.W. to N.W. steering
down for Ocean Island nothing in sight

Thursday January 20
Light winds from the N.W. steering S.W.
at 10 A.M. raised Sperm Whales and lowered 4
Boats for them struck and saved 4 Whales at 3 P.M.
