Light variable winds from the Eastward steering

Very rainy last night with a stiff breeze from
the Eastward steering by the wind to the South
and Saw Humpbacks Lat 1:45 Long 152:22

Friday December 10

A light breeze from the Eastward steering by the wind
under all sail Lat 0:00 miles south Long 152:13

Saturday December 11

A light breeze from the Eastward steering by
the wind under all sail Saw Blackfish
Lat 10:00 Long 152:35

Sunday December 12

Moderate breeze from the N E to S E working to
the Eastward at 4 last Evening at parted of the
crew got the Steward down in the forecabin
and refused to let him come on deck when called
by the captain and Officers on account of the
Captains Whipping the steward but after a short
time we got him up and put 8 of the main men
and then gave 2 of the sacred ones I dozen
apiece sent them to their daily after they had
signed a written acknowledge that they would behave
