

Journal of A Whaling Voyage kept on board Ship

Friday September the 10th 1841
These 24 hours fresh gales from the S to W steering
S & by E under whole topsails Saw a
sail standing to the Eastward hauled
over Blackfish blubber started 1 Bar of Oil
Lat 37° 25' Long 33° 05' East



Saturday September the 11th
These 24 hours fresh gales from the Southward steering
by the wind at 9 A.M. close reefed the topsails
boiled out our Black Fish Lat by Obs 37° 00' Long 35° 00'

Sunday September the 12th
Moderate gales from the S & E to W steering S & E
at 9 A.M. made all sail. Saw Black fish
Lat by Obs 36° 41' Long by Chron 35° 15'

Monday September the 13th
Moderate gales from the NW to SW steering S & E
under all sail Long 38° 50'

Tuesday September the 14th
A moderate breeze from the Westward steering
S & E under all sail Pointed the Bow Boat
Lat 37° 58' Long 41° 30'

Wednesday September the 15th
Fresh gales from the NW steering S & E and
S & by E under all sail Lat 39° 00' Long 48° 45'

Thursday September 16th
These 24 hours fresh gales from the NW steering
S & E under all sail Lat 38° 50' Long 49° 45'

Friday September the 17th 1841
These 24 hours fresh gales from the NW steering
S & E under all sail Lat 39° 15' Long 54° 10'

Saturday September 18th
Fresh gales from the NW steering S & E under
all sail Struck a Porpoise and lost it Lat 39° 00' Long 53° 10'

Sunday September 19th
Fresh gales from the NW steering S & E and S by E
under all sail Lat 39° 00' Long 62° 17'

Monday September 20th
First and small part moderate gales from the
S to N by W latter part fresh gales from NW
steering S & E under all sail Lat 39° 45' Long 68° 50'

Tuesday September 21st
Fresh gales from NW steering S & E under all
sail Lat 39° 45' Long 69° 10' So Ends

Wednesday September 22nd
Fresh gales from the S by W to NW, S & E Course -
at 1 A.M. double reefed the topsails and
looked in the mainsail at 6 set the fore
topgallant sail at 10 set the fore
latter part fresh gales from the NW to SW at
6 P.M. look in topgallant sail and set the mainsail
Saw 2 Ships Lat 39° 49' Long 73° 35'



Thursday September 23rd
These 24 hours fresh gales and heavy squalls
from NW steering S & E at 6 A.M. made
all sail
