

Journal of Voyage Kept on Board Ship

Sunday August 29th 1841
These 24 hours fresh gales from N to W steering S by E at 5 PM double reefed the topsails
Lat 34° 54' Long 82° 5'

Monday August 30th
A moderate breeze from the N to S W steering S by E at 8 AM made all sail at 2 PM
Bent a new shoulder-reef and bent it
Sail in sight Lat 35° 25' Long 80° 03' West
at 3 PM passed the Meridian of Greenwich

Tuesday August 31st
Moderate breezes from the S to W steering S by E under all sail broke out for the Shetland Isles
struck 2 porpoises and lost them
Saw 2 Sails Lat 35° 15' Long 78° 54' East

Wednesday September 1st 1841
moderate breezes from N to W S W steering S by E under all sail Sail in sight
Broke out for Beef and Pork

Thursday September 2nd
These 24 hours squally weather wind from the Westward steering S by E Broke out and got up 3 casks of water at 3 PM took in the Bow Boat and turned up the Mast Sail Lat 36° 32' Long 83° 7'

Friday September 3rd
First and middle part fresh breezes from N W to South latter part light breeze W steering S by E & S by E
Employed on ship's Duty Lat 36° 31' Long 82° 5'

Saturday September the 4th 1841
These 24 hours squally weather and fresh breezes from the Westward steering S by E at 5 PM single reefed the Fore and Mizen topsails Lat 36° 41' S Long 84° 35'

Sunday September 5th
These 24 hours rather squally with a fresh breeze from the N W W steering S by E at day I last night set the Fore topmast shrouding sail at 4 PM passed the Cape of Good Hope and entered the Indian Ocean
Saw Black Bird Lat 36° 56' Long

Monday September 6th
A stiff breeze from the Westward with frequent squalls steering S by E saw a sail standing to the Westward
Lat 36° 51' Long 82° 05'

Tuesday September 7th
A moderate breeze from the S W to S E steering S by E and by the wind Lat 37° 00' Long 82° 25'

Wednesday September 8th  Bright Wind
These 24 hours fresh gales from E to N E steering by the wind under single and close reefed topsails
at 3 PM Saw a Whight Whale Lat 36° 15' Long 82° 00'

Thursday September 9th
First part fresh gales middle and latter part moderate gales from the N E to S W steering S by E at 6 PM made all sail at 2 PM
lowered for Blackfish the Starboard Boat got it and the Starboard A took them to the Ship and hoisted them in
Lat 36° 32' Long 80° 45' So Ends
