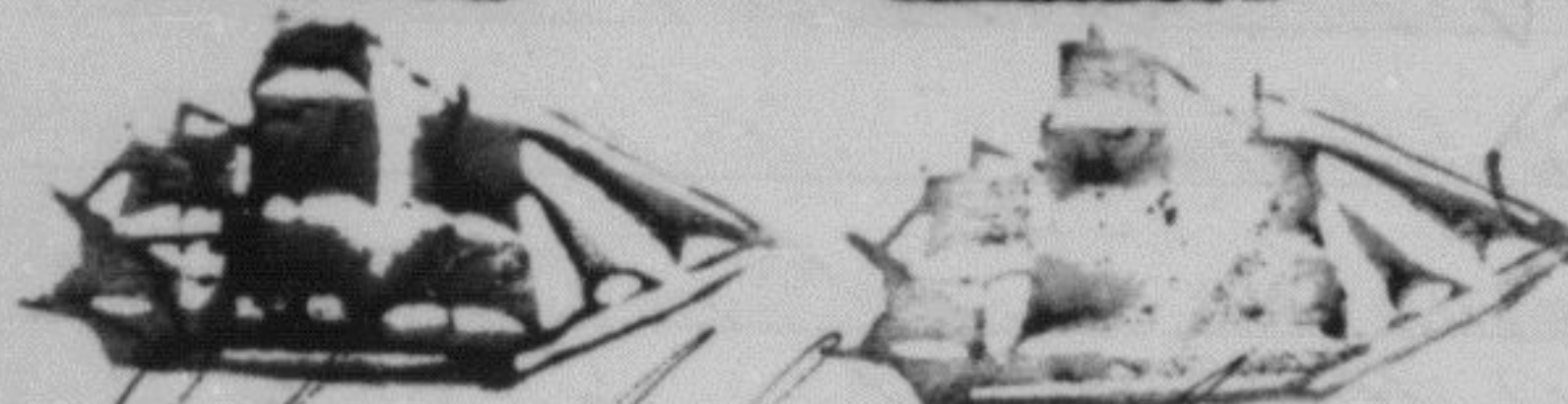


Journal of A. Meling Voyage kept on board

Cruising A By S distant
10 miles saw it sail last
night About 2 o'clock standing to the Northward
at 7 AM doubled the Cape and hauled
up the courses This Island is Flores N of the
Western Islands it lies in lat $3^{\circ} 26'$ long $81^{\circ} 07'$

Thursday July 1st 1841
A light breeze from the SW steering to the
wind to the S & raised the land this morn-
ing hearing A By Sea Pagal and St George
at 7 AM spoke the Clifford Wagner of
Fairhaven 3 months out 24 boxes from
Paget 25 bls of sperm John Greenall reports
the Heroine of St George 1 month out 15 bls of sperm



Friday July 2nd
Calm pleasant weather Cruising to the
N of Pagal at 7 AM hauled up the
courses and took in topsails and sails
Saw Porpoises and Killers and 4 sails

Saturday July 3rd
A light breeze from the Northward Cruising
Made sail this morning saw a plenty of
Porpoise & sails in sight Spoke the

Capt. Eastham and spoke the Heroine
of Fairhaven Capt Smith & says out 75 bls
of Sperm oil and also the Grease of Dunsey
1 month out 350 bls of Sperm oil
Pagal Sea St George Greenison in sight to the South

Sunday July 4th 1841
A light breeze from the Northward Cruising
of St George 4 ships in sight saw Porpoises
and Killers the Islands of Pagal St George
Sea and Gracioso in sight



Monday July 5th 1841
A stiff breeze from the NE lay to light night
untill 3 this morning when we squared
the yards and kept her off for Pagal
and went on shore and landed got
our recruits 140 Bushels of Potatoes of various
Calhoun and Humphreys and stood out
licking sail its single reefed topsails
the Daring of Say Fairhaven landed 40 bls
of sperm oil the day 1 Portuguese and French
Sloop of war lying at Anchor 1 sail in sight



Tuesday July 6th
A stiff breeze from the NE standing
on the wind to the Northward untill 8
AM when the Captain discovered
that his pocket had been picked of his
Watch Bag but night on shore at 10
