

Journal of A Voyage kept on Board Ship *Sharon*

Tuesday May 25th inst 1841

This day commences with a stiff breeze from the S.W. at Sunrise this morning took our Anchor and commenced to beat out of the harbour. At 2 P.M. discharged our Pilot at 5 P.M. stowed our anchors at 7 chose watches and kept the Ship her course for the Whaling ground

Wednesday May 26th
A stiff breeze from the S.W. steering on the wind heading S.E. by E under topsails and courses the Watches employed in fitting the Boats & a number of scubins.

Thursday May 27th inst
A light breeze from the Southward steering on the wind to the Eastward until 1 P.M. when we tacked and stood to the Westward Boatswains employed in fitting the Boats the rest of the watch employed in Ships duty & sails in sight

Friday May 28th inst
A light breeze from the Southward steering on the wind to the Westward at 4 P.M. saw Blackfish and lowered 3 Boats for them but got none

Saturday May 29th inst
